Director, Institute for Policy & Social Research, University of Kansas (May 2019-present).
The Institute for Policy & Social Research (IPSR) supports the research and education missions of KU. Housed within the Office of Research, IPSR fulfills the significant role of bringing social scientists and policy researchers together to conduct innovative research that informs decision-making at the local, state, and national levels. IPSR is home to 28.2 FTE employees. Of those, 7.25 are fully funded by state money and the remainder are in grant-funded, “soft money” positions. IPSR hosts seven interdisciplinary, faculty-led research centers and has over 150 faculty affiliates. In FY 2025, IPSR had a non-sponsored budget of \$4.7 million and managed \$18 million in sponsored research projects. IPSR has a 28% success rate on federal research funding proposals and an overall return on investment of 375%.
